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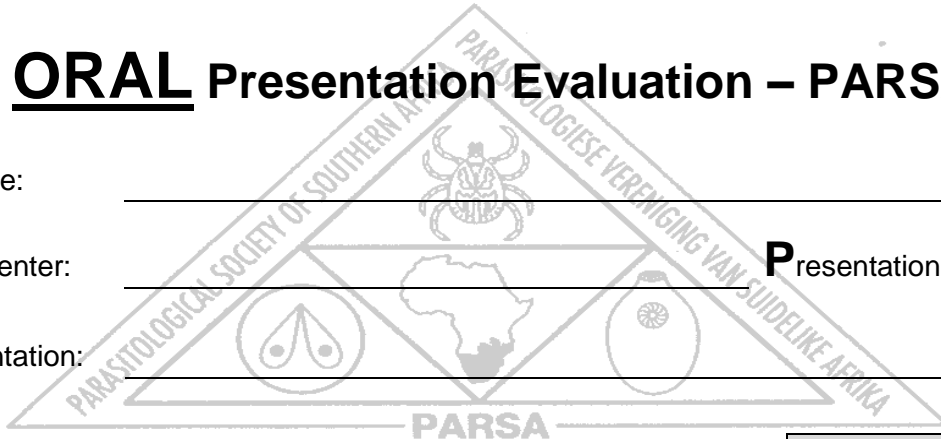

3.	Results & Discussion: <u>clearly</u> and <u>concisely</u> presented; important patterns or trends emphasized; clear insight and interpretation of results; contribution of results in context of previous studies clearly & concisely described; relevance or application of findings Comments:	15	
4.	Conclusion: clear; concise summation of important points Comments:	5	
5.	Manner of presentation: good eye contact with audience, good volume & varying tone of voice; appropriate rate of presentation; avoid use of distracting 'fillers' (e.g., 'um', 'uh', & 'you know) or irritating mannerisms; enthusiastic presentation; effective use of notes (if used – not overly dependent on notes; still make eye contact with audience; not reading in monotone); systematic flow of information Comments:	10	
6.	Visual Aids: well-designed; integrated into presentation; appropriate font (easily read & sufficiently large); figures and tables with appropriate amounts of information; large clear diagrams and photos; easy on the eye flow of information Comments:	5
